PE and Sport Premium Allocation 2016 - 17

For 2016 - 17 the school's allocation of PE and Sport Premium funding was £9,735.00.

This funding was spent in order to meet three key aims:

- **To improve the quality of PE provision particularly with regards to the development of active learning on the playgrounds and through providing high quality resources for use in PE lessons**
- **To increase participation in physical exercise and competitive sport through staff CPD**
- **To support and involve the least active children by providing targeted activities, lunchtime staff and entry into sports competitions**
