

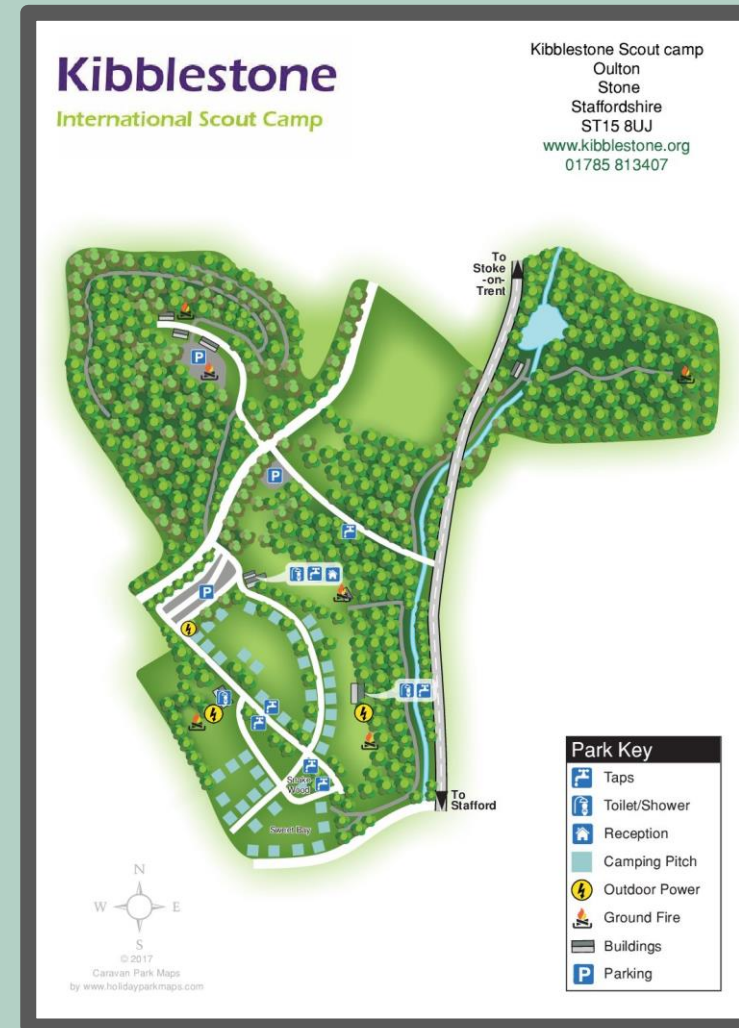
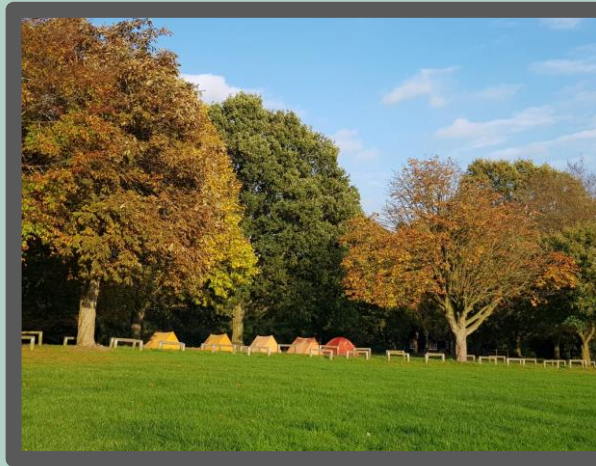

Medication

- All medical needs to be identified within the packs given
- Medication to be handed in before the trip clearly labelled
- Any serious medical needs to **be discussed with lead teachers before the camp**
- Allergy needs to be recorded on packs
- Basic medication kit will be carried - children must have permission
- All medication to be in a **see-through labelled plastic zipper bag with clear instructions - please check dates!**

Behaviour

1. A high standard of behaviour is expected at all times.
2. Instructions should be followed immediately when given by any member of staff.
3. Children must remain within sight of a designated adult at all times.
4. After lights out you may only leave your room for the toilet or if there is a serious problem such as someone is unwell. If this is the case then go to the designated adult.
5. All children are expected to take part in the activities and events to the best of their ability.
6. Unkind behaviour, name calling or physical aggression towards any other child will not be tolerated.

The need to collect

- Children will need to sign a behaviour contract before the visit
- Children will be representing the school and their behaviour should reflect this
- Parents will be asked to sign and complete a contact form to show that you are willing to collect pupils if needed:
- If children are persistently misbehaving parents may be asked to collect students
- If a child is particularly unwell, parents may be asked to

Do's and Don'ts

- Do not be late
- Do label absolutely everything
- No digital or expensive items including phones, electronic consoles, games etc
- Do bring multiple layers of clothes, long sleeved tops!
- Do prepare for the weather e.g. sun hats and sun tan lotion and waterproof clothes
- Do not worry about the food
- Do remember to bring a named water bottle with you
- Don't forget your indoor shoes
- Remember old, comfy clothes, it is not a fashion show!
